Requirements to receive an Academic Letter:

Students must meet both a cumulative grade point average requirement and earn points for participating in extra-curricular academic activities or approved academic competitions.

1) The following scale will be used to determine eligibility status:

- Current 9th and 10th grade students must have a cumulative grade point average of 94 or higher.
- Current 11th and 12th grade students must have a cumulative grade point average of 92 or higher.

2) Student must receive a minimum of 12 points to apply.

- A student may receive only one Academic Letter at LFO.
- Each additional 6 points will earn the student a BAR for his/her letter (only one letter per student).

3) Points will be awarded each school year on the following basis:

- Any student transferring points over from previous years needs to denote the year of each point.
- Please note the name of the organization (DECA, NHS, etc.) to which you credit your points.
- AP, SAT, and ACT Scores need to be verified by Ms. Gigandet (senior counselor).
- Competitions that do not award individual places or individual medals, competitions that qualify the student for band or athletic letters, or competitions that are group events do not count.
